## Won a Contract for SDGs Promotion Planning Support Operations from Inabe City (Hyakugo Research Institute)

Hyakugo Research Institute, a group company of the Bank, accepted a contract for SDGs promotion planning support operations from Inabe City in FY2020, and engaged in raising awareness and promoting SDGs among business operators in Inabe City.

After Inabe City was selected as a "Model Project for Local Government SDGs<sup>\*1</sup>" and an "SDGs Future City<sup>\*2</sup>" by the Office for Promotion of Regional Revitalization in the Cabinet Office in July 2020, Hyakugo Research Institute, which has strengths in regional revitalization, began support operations in October 2020.

Specifically, the institute incorporated opinions from external experts in industry, academia and government, formulated an "Inabe City SDGs Evaluation Sheet" enabling business operators in Inabe City to recognize their own initiatives related to the SDGs, and held workshops and built

a dedicated website for the purpose of promoting the utilization of business operators within the city and broadly communicating knowledge and information on SDGs. This initiative led to 76



responses to the SDGs

check sheet from business operators within Inabe City throughout the duration of the project. In addition, communication such as a workshop enabling people to have fun learning about the SDGs concept by playing a card game led to fostering awareness that familiar initiatives are linked to SDGs.

The institute will continue to engage in a variety of initiatives enabling Inabe City to further develop as an SDGs future city.

#### Volunteer Activities

#### Cooperation with UNICEF's "Coin Aid" campaign

We support the activities of UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund) engaged in community development focusing on children in developing countries. Since April 2007, the Bank has set up UNICEF's "Coin Aid" donation boxes at 19 branches. Foreign coins donated by numerous customers who visited our branches are collected at the headquarters of the Bank once a year and delivered to the Japan Commit-

tee for UNICEF on a regular basis.

The coins that are collected are converted into cash and used in support activities such as improving health, ensuring nutrition, spreading primary education and providing emergency aid for children in over 150 countries and regions worldwide.



## Participation in UNESCO's "Miswritten Postcards" campaign

Every year, we participate in the "Miswritten Postcards" campaign run by the UNESCO Liaison Council of Mie Prefecture. A call is put out within the bank to collect unused postcards and New Year's cards that have not been posted, and the collected postcards are sent to the UNESCO Liaison Council of Mie Prefecture.

These postcards are converted into cash, and the funds

are used for making places to learn\* for children who cannot go to school and adults who cannot read in locations such as Afghanistan, India, Cambodia, Nepal and Laos.

## Mie competition of Economics Koshien

Every year since 2011, the Bank has held the Mie competition of Economics Koshien, a national finance and economics quiz tournament for high-school students, under the joint sponsorship of the Association for the Promotion of Financial Literacy, a non-profit organization.

With financial knowledge becoming increasingly necessary amid diversifying financial and economic conditions, the tournament aims to provide an opportunity for high school students to have fun learning about finance and economics.

We were not able to hold the 10th Mie competition in December 2020 in person due to the impact of COVID-19, but we held it online. Thirty high school students in 15 teams
